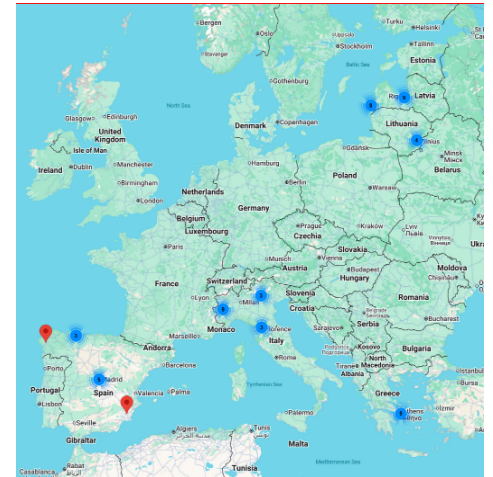


## TRANSNATIONAL MAPPING TOOL DEVELOPED

Transnational Mapping Tool of **green enterprises** across Europe has been developed. Tool includes story map with a collection of good examples of green oriented organisations employing deaf and hard of

hearing people (DHH), based on a set of specific criteria for collection, such as country, description, language, sector, provider etc.

The goal of this Transnational Mapping Tool is increasing awareness of organisations employing DHH individuals and implement green practices. Tool is available on project webpage.



## GREEN COMMITMENT MEMORANDUM SIGNED

A **Green Commitment Memorandum** was signed, demonstrating the project partners shared responsibility for ensuring environmentally friendly practices in the GREENENTRE4DEAF project.

By signing the Memorandum, each partner confirmed their commitment to implementing sustainability measures such as Sustainable Project Management, Green Learning and Digital Sustainability, Green Entrepreneurship in the Living Hubs, and Quarterly Self-Assessment Reports.

## FIRST CONSULTATION SESSION TOOK PLACE

The GREENENTRE4DEAF project launched its first round of **consultation sessions**, organised in every partner country, where DHH participants, higher education professionals, and green entrepreneurs came together to co-design inclusive strategies for green entrepreneurship education.



During these sessions, stakeholders openly discussed barriers to participation, identified systemic and institutional challenges, shared valuable best practices, and explored innovative opportunities for collaboration.

The collected insights will be used to shape VR-based simulations, digital tools, and structured training modules that foster sustainability, digital inclusion, and accessible lifelong learning.

## VIDEO INTERVIEWS

To make the Transnational Mapping Tool more engaging and informative, the project partners are creating **video interviews** with green and DHH entrepreneurs, along with videos showcasing green occupations and enterprises.



These interviews highlight the daily green practices and initiatives of various organisations. They also provide insights into companies' experiences employing DHH individuals and promoting their integration into green initiatives.

The interviews also explore company background, specific green practices, experiences employing DHH individuals, and future goals for sustainability and inclusion.

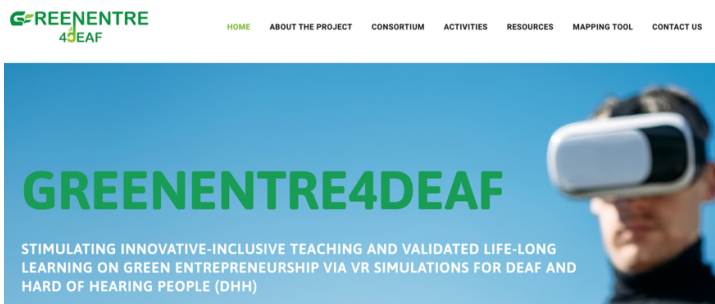
## PROJECT OUTREACH
