U.BI.TEACH - Developing Practical Learning Pathways for Urban Innovation



The **U.BI.TEACH** project continues to advance its work in supporting higher education institutions through innovative and practice-oriented learning approaches. In this phase, the consortium has focused on the development of comprehensive training modules, complemented by the creation of **Learning Snacks**—short, targeted educational resources designed to enhance accessibility and engagement.

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Training Modules: Building the Core Learning Framework

The major milestone of the project is the development of a set of structured training modules tailored for higher education.

These modules provide:

- a strong theoretical and methodological foundation
- integration of service-learning approaches
- practical tools and guidance for educators

They are designed to support learners in:

- understanding urban and sustainability challenges
- applying participatory and inclusive methods

LEARNING SNACKS: MAKING LEARNING MORE ACCESSIBLE

To complement the modules, U.BI.TEACH has developed a set of **Learning Snacks**—short, focused learning units designed to make key concepts more accessible and easier to integrate into teaching and learning activities.

Learning Snacks:

- translate core module content into concise and practical formats
- are designed for quick uptake and flexible use
- support both teaching activities and self-learning

They can be used as:

- introductory content to key topics
- reinforcement tools within courses
- stand-alone resources for targeted learning

This approach helps simplify complex concepts while maintaining alignment with the broader learning objectives of the modules.
